Connie brings not only her 13 years of experience with SCF, but also seven years of working for the Fairfield-Suisun Adult School where she taught in the business education high school diploma classes. She gained non-profit experience as the training program manager for Solano Works Services, managing a full-time bakery as a training platform.

Connie retired from the U. S. Navy as a lieutenant commander after seventeen years' service. She earned a bachelor's degree in secondary education at the University of Wisconsin, Eau Claire; and has a master's degree in human development and adult education from The George Washington University in Washington, D.C. She is a resident of Vallejo.

"I'm honored and pleased to serve as the foundation's CEO. I am dedicated to moving the foundation forward, and welcome the opportunity to increase our capacity to meet the needs of the communities we serve. We value the partnerships we have built with our donors, fundholders, local businesses, and Solano non-profits. I want to continue to create a deep and lasting positive impact on the quality of life in Solano County with individuals and organizations that share this goal," said Connie of her appointment.

Samantha Fordyce, from Vallejo, joined in November, and fills the new development assistant position.

Connie and her staff are enthusiastically looking forward to 2015. The coming year will offer a new schedule of NPP workshops and funding opportunities. The annual Wong Music Mini-grant cycle will begin in early February, and the application process for scholarship awards will begin in March.
